



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

ravel to Niagara often leads visitors to the main tourist district - the iconic Clifton
Hill area - with its many attractions and access to the American, Bridal Veil, and Horseshoe Falls, which collectively form the south end of the Niagara River. Already well-known as the honeymoon capital of the world, films such as Niagara, starring Marilyn Monroe and Superman II, starring Christopher Reeve highlight the wonder and natural beauty of the popular destination.

Over the years, the city has continued to garner the well-deserved attention of several international investors from many different industries. Touted today as the "world's most famous address" by one of its mayors, James "Jim" Diodati, Niagara is quickly becoming the go-to place for business as much as pleasure.

HISTORY OF COMMERCE IN NIAGARA

Commercial activity in Niagara dates back to the early industrial settlers of the 1780s. As settlement grew, so did the demand for suppliers and services. John Burtch, one of the earliest known entrepreneurs of the area, was the first to build a saw and grist mill in 1785 and utilize the water of the Niagara River for his industrial needs. Over the course of the next 25 years, Niagara became home to tanneries, shoemakers, iron works, inns, taverns, stage coach lines, merchants, as well as medical practices, who as entrepreneurs, began to recognize the strategic advantages of the region. These humble beginnings lay the foundation for what would one day become a thriving city with a robust economy, known for its world-class infrastructure and major business opportunities.

In 1895, Nikola Tesla and George Westinghouse built the world's first hydroelectric power plant at Niagara Falls. This critical link between businesses and research partners allows for the commercialization of ideas, services, and products, and the creation of tech-focused ventures. As a result of these partnerships, Niagara continues to produce a highly skilled and in-demand workforce trained by institutions such as Brock University and Niagara



College Canada, who deliver industry-driven programs. According to Niagara Economic Development, the region has seen double-digit job growth over the past seven years in sectors like computer systems design, scientific research and development, and architecture and engineering. In an effort to build on the innovative tech trend, Niagara partners are actively involved with a diverse range of incubators and accelerators, including Innovate Niagara, the Generator at one, iHub Niagara, ncTakeOff, and the Business Innovation Zone.

iagara's local food scene reads like a classic coming of age story. One of its humble beginnings was the maturing process that led Niagara down the path of culinary distinction - from mainly orchards and tender fruit growers to becoming Canada's hottest destination for food and wine. As the economy began to shift away from traditional manufacturing, Niagara began to see evolution on the menu, literally. Wineries and restaurants stepped up to breathe new and flavourful life into the surrounding areas, then shortly after, the culinary tourism was born.

In a sense, it was always here, hiding in plain sight, and buried deep in the soil and in the hearts of locals. Just less than 50 years ago, the only winery was Andres. Everyone drank their famous Baby Duck wine, which was both sparkling and sweet. Locals have always been loyal to supporting hometown brands and businesses. We believe it is that ardent pride that has blossomed into the flourishing industry we have here today.

As a region, we are in the unique position of having the perfect microclimate for



the summer months offering up innovative











and delicious interpretations of the classic delights. Niagara is also becoming known for its pop-up dinner series and supper markets. Annual events include celebrations such as Icewine Festival, The Niagara Wine Festival, Summer Downtown D'lish, and Ribfest, to name just a few. Blessed with Profound Natural Bounty

estled snugly between Toronto and Buffalo, the Niagara region claims home to a little spot carved out by glaciers 12,000 years ago. The region itself is made up of twelve individual municipalities, each a unique and beautiful puzzle piece that makes up the Golden Horseshoe. The diversity and variety of the geographical landscape here is second to none. While Niagara is home to its most famous landmark, Niagara Falls, the region has many other remarkable natural wonders.

Visitors are often enticed to make the trip because of the breathtaking natural wonder; witnessing its tremendous power is an experience that is nearly impossible to describe to another. Those who seek further exploration into Niagara continue to be enthralled with how expansive, raw, and beautiful the region is. It is also astounding how accessible the Backpacking and cycling adventures have continued to grow in popularity throughout the world, especially throughout Europe. Niagara is proud to be the home to over 40 walking and cycling trails, pleasing everyone from the eager outdoorsman to the novice or even reluctant adventurer. The trails are so varied and plentiful that you need only to decide what kind of surroundings you crave. From Short Hills Provincial Park to the Bruce Trail, to the Welland Canals, and beautiful Merritt Island, instant rejuvenation is always at hand.

If you are looking for a beautiful marshland with a wheelchair accessible boardwalk, you may want to visit Chippawa Creek. If bird watching and nature hikes are your interests, then pay visits to the Rockway and Wooden conservation areas. The Niagara Escarpment boasts hundreds of acres of natural playground carved from majestic trees to regal slopes guaranteed to delight people from around the globe.

The Escarpment truly delivers a unique advantage to Niagara. It is a story millions of years in the making and what gives the region its unique features and varied ecological qualities. The Niagara Escarpment is such an important ecological area that it is designated as a World Biosphere Reserve by the United Nations Educational Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO). It is what has shaped the land and what has blessed us with profound natural bounty. This area was once the bed of an ancient shallow sea, with fossils dating back 450 million years, representing some of the planet's first complex organisms. Niagara is also surrounded by two Great Lakes: Lake Ontario to the north and Lake Erie to the south, both feeding several rivers, canals, and waterfalls. If you want to see other beautiful waterfalls up close

and personal, then it's just a quick trip from the Niagara core to Balls Falls, Decew Falls, Rockway Falls, or Beamer's Falls.

Not only is it blessed with seemingly unlimited rustic treasures, there is also an area rich in history for the buffs among us. One only need to look to Niagara Parks for a list of significant historic attractions, from Fort George to Fort Brock's Monument and Laura Secord's Homestead.

You can visit the first school in Upper Canada here or Butler's Burial Ground. There is also Rodman Hall which is not only an art gallery but a historic house. Being situated between the Escarpment and Lake Ontario creates a unique weather climate that is neither too warm nor too cold, perfect for grape and tender fruit growing. This provides us with the privilege of being in a protected green belt and privy to all the bounty that the growing fields have to offer. As you cycle or drive our serene country lanes, be sure to stop at a roadside stand for fresh fruit, pies, jams, and more. Nothing tastes as good as produce cultivated directly from fertile and rich local soils.

Welcoming millions of worldwide travellers all year round, Niagara is undeniably a wellknown getaway for families, new couples, and friends seeking to explore. Conversely, Niagara boasts everything you would hope for in a business destination. The sprawling views of both Canada and the United States are nothing short of spectacular. Offering multiple access points by air, rail, port, and road, complimented with its profound natural bounty, Niagara is an absolute must for your next big event.

Centuries of Continuous Growth and Innovation

he interpretation of entrepreneurship often varies through the lens in which it is viewed. However, the core concept and definition remain rather consistent throughout the history books.

Looking back for originating entrepreneurial examples, there are hunter and gatherer stories that originate as early as 17,000 BCE, which are followed by major shifts in human history around 10,000 BCE, during the first agricultural revolution.

The nomadic lifestyle began to evolve to a more stationary approach, concentrating efforts on farming the land. Entrepreneurial leverage was born, as farmers could cultivate more than they required for their immediate family, whereas a hunter could not.

Niagara's entrepreneurial landscape possesses some of the most powerful stories in history, just have a quick peek at Sir Adam Beck. Known for dominating Ontario politics for a full generation, he created and expanded the Hydro-Electric Power Commission of Ontario into the largest publicly owned power authority in


When reviewing our transportation trade history, you will no doubt learn about Sir William Hamilton Merritt and his hand in constructing the Welland Canal.

Of course, our entrepreneurial roots were also firmly planted in tourism, beginning in 1796 with the first hotels emerging in Chippawa. By the early 1820s, the area began drawing regular visitors as a destination. By 1929, Niagara was home to its first high rise hotel, The General Brock Hotel, an 11-storey building, making it by far the tallest building around. It boasted 247 bedrooms, 16 stories, 290 phones, and two elevators within its 20,000 square feet area.

Supply and demand have always and will continue to be what carve out the evolution of entrepreneurship. The innate desire to provide new solutions to ever-evolving problems will always unveil the next level of entrepreneurship through innovation, technology advancement, and perseverance.

hen planning an event of any size, the format in which food will be served is a very critical element. Depending on the size and style of event and the arrangement and flow of your space, you'll want to consider each option carefully when selecting the most effective and efficient food service.

STATIONS

The station option is similar to a cocktail style reception. It offers a tremendous amount of flexibility both for food selection as well as timing and seating. This option is ideal for large groups or events with unique product displays and table arrangements. Stations are customizable and can be transformed into live kitchens, where you can impress your attendees by having the chefs prepare and cook food right before their eyes.

The most formal of the options, it also requires more detailed planning. You'll have to keep in mind food restrictions and preferences, and plan accordingly for more organized seating with place card settings to ensure effective delivery of selection options.

BUFFET

This popular choice offers you menu flexibility, typically with a few choices for the main dish, sides, and salads. Consider whether your attendees will collect their plates from their seats or from the beginning of the buffet line as well as whether you will release tables all at once, or a few at a time. For table arrangements, this format will require full seating for each guest.

Ask your venue representatives what serving options they would recommend for your event. Then, consider that feedback in your final decision of how to serve your attendees.





Negotiating Tips **Every Event Planner** Should Know

chieving the best rates and coming in on or even below budget is every planner's goal. It can sometimes feel like a daunting task. However, negotiating the best rates can often be achieved by adopting open and honest lines of communication with your suppliers. Here are the top seven things to help you negotiate a better deal before booking your next big event.

preparation

7 Know exactly what you want to achieve for your event. Have a clear plan outlined. Understand the value your event will bring to the venue.

budget conversation

Everyone has a budget. Instead of waiting for a final quote and negotiating down, talk about numbers early on. The venue can then gauge what value they can provide within your limits. Perhaps the venue may even propose better alternatives that would work for both sides. Being open and honest about cost restrictions will allow an efficient collaborative effort. Of course, be mindful and realistic with your expectations as well.

date flexibility

3 If it's at all possible to be flexible with dates, be up-front right away. You can easily secure better rates by working with your venues outside of peak periods. If you are planning far enough in advance, then you can even ask the venue for open dates they are looking to fill on their end. You may be able to secure a large savings by doing this.

discounts & contingencies

When looking at your overall event needs,

understand what realistic opportunities you have that could result in some cost breaks. For example, if you're renting all your AV equipment from one supplier, it could be within reason to ask that podiums or projectors be added at no additional cost. Or for catering, maybe for every 200 table settings, you get 10 free. Never forget to ask for a contingency clause to cover any lastminute additions because we all know that one or two things will pop up that may need attention. If you've negotiated even a 5% contingency fee to cover this off, you won't break your budget in the 11th hour.

shared resources

5Have you ever considered menu sharing? hosting concurrent events, ask the venue staff about other events scheduled for the same day. Ask if there is any opportunity to collaborate with the other event hosts on joining forces over menu items that may reduce costs on both sides. This kind of resource sharing doesn't need to be limited to food either, so be creative and ask questions to see what other options might be possible

never make assumptions Even if you're experienced or have done

 $oldsymbol{\delta}$ business with a specific venue several times in the past, never leave room for assumptions. Ask questions, and then ask more questions. Never be afraid to ask for clarification or discuss seemingly minor details at length, especially if they are critical to the success of your event.

inspect & verify
_When it comes to contracts, there are

a few things you need to always be cautious about. Be wary of any one-sided agreement. There should always be shared responsibility represented. Swap out any vague and confusing language for more concise and clear statements. Always read the fine print.



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
